

I READ CANADIAN TOOLKIT FOR LIBRARIANS

A month before I Read Canadian Day:

- Ask your municipality to declare I Read Canadian Day on February 17th. There may be a
 proclamation form to fill out. Contact your public librarian/city councilor for details.
- Prepare lists of Canadian authors to encourage reading of Canadian authors
- Create #IREadCanadian kits for borrowing
- Create a Canadian StoryWalk for patrons and educators <u>What's a StoryWalk?</u>
- Review the resources available at https://ireadcanadian.com/day/
- Sign up your school or library for free at: https://ireadcanadian.com/day/
- Review IRC <u>logos and downloads</u>
- Write newsletter articles to promote IRC day to staff and community with links to websites and promotional videos. <u>Sample templates are here</u>
- Post IRC Day on community calendars
- Recruit and define roles for virtual volunteers to help on Feb 17

- Add an IRC Facebook Frames <u>English</u> or <u>French</u> to FB accounts.
- Book an author visit for your library <u>The Writers Union of Canada</u> will subsidize some of the cost and <u>CANSCAIP</u> website has great suggestions
- Order IRC promotional items from the <u>Library Marketplace</u>
- Contact local schools to collaborate re: virtual presentations with your students.
- Add the https://ireadcanadian.com/day/ and a logo to your email signature

Suggestions for February:

- Confirm volunteer duties (making displays, posters, virtual read aloud etc.) and schedule for Feb. 17
- Invite local celebrities to be a virtual guest reader on IRC Day (invite local government officials, athletes, board members too!)
- Replenish Canadian book displays and encourage reading of Canadian authors
- Ask students to blog or book talk the Canadian books they have read to others
- Publish newsletters to celebrate IRC day to staff and community
